#### **Organizational Priorities – Dave Hardy**

#### Boys' Latin SY2021 Priorities

- Provide a rigorous education that adheres to the Pennsylvania standards.
- Zero defect student participation and engagement.
- Team commitment to effective, measurable delivery and improvement of our educational program.

#### Boys' Latin of Philadelphia

- We are a charter school, bound by the intent of the charter legislation.
- We are a school with a singular focus college.
- We utilize the "prep-school model".

#### Empowered by PA Act 22 of 1997

• Purpose: "... to provide opportunities for teachers, parents, pupils, and community members to establish and maintain schools that operate **independently** from the existing school district structure..."

• Created as a method to accomplish very specific objectives. You need to know what they are...

#### Act 22 Objectives

- 1. Improve pupil learning.
- 2. Increase learning opportunities for all pupils.
- 3. Encourage the use of different and innovative teaching methods.
- 4. Creating new professional opportunities for teachers, including the opportunity to be responsible for the learning program at the school site.
- 5. Provide parents and pupils with expanded choices in the types of educational opportunities that are available within the public school system.
- 6. Hold the schools established under this act accountable for meeting measurable academic standards and provide the school with a method to establish accountability systems.

# Our focus is our commitment to address enormous problem in Philadelphia public education

- Black and brown males have an abysmal track record in college matriculation.
- Our school was chartered to specifically address that problem.
- The circumstances of our chartering permits us to focus unapologetically on black and brown males.
